<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Incapacity and Treatment: A period of incapacity of more than three consecutive full calendar days and any subsequent treatment or period of incapacity relating to the same condition, that also involves:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Treatment two or more times within 30 days of the first day of incapacity, unless extenuating circumstances exist, OR • Treatment by a health care provider on at least one occasion which results in a regimen of continuing treatment under the supervision of the health care provider. • Treatment means an in-person visit to a health care provider. The first (or only) in-person treatment visit must take place within seven (7) days of the first day of incapacity.
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Pregnancy: Any period of incapacity due to pregnancy, or for prenatal care.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Chronic Conditions Requiring Treatments: Any period of incapacity or treatment for such incapacity due to a chronic condition which:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Requires periodic visits for treatment by a health care provider or by a nurse physician's assistant under direct supervision of health care provider; • Continues over an extended period of time (including recurring episodes of a single underlying condition); AND • May cause episodic rather than a continuing period of incapacity. Examples: <i>asthma, diabetes, epilepsy.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Permanent/Long-term Conditions: A period of incapacity, which is permanent or long-term due to a condition for which treatment may not be effective. The employee or family member must be under the continuing supervision of, but need not be receiving active treatment by, a health care provider. Examples: <i>Alzheimer's, a severe stroke, or the terminal stages of a disease.</i></p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Multiple Treatments (Non-Chronic Conditions): Any period of absence to receive multiple treatments (including any period of recovery therefrom) by a health care provider or by a provider of health care services under orders of, or on referral by, a health care provider, either for restorative surgery after an accident or other injury, or for a condition that would likely result in a period of incapacity of more than three consecutive calendar days in the absence of medical intervention or treatment. Examples: <i>cancer (chemotherapy, radiation, etc.) severe arthritis (physical therapy), and kidney disease (dialysis).</i></p>
